


River St construction work delayed by weather. RPI will begin February 2025.

- There was 7 formal **Zoning Verification Letter** requested during the month of January.








The District Attorney received 60 case files and Lowndes County State Court received 24 case files to assist in prosecuting cases for both entities made by Patrol and Support personnel.




Capital/Equipment Projects Update


